世界エイズ・結核・マラリア対策基金 (グローバルファンド)



英国とドイツで医師として勤務したほか、1990年代末のエイズ治療の黎明期に、キリスト教ドイツ医師団の副所長としてボツワナ、ケニア、ロシア等におけるエイズ治療のパイロット・プロジェクトに従事。また、タンザニアでは数年にわたり農村部のルター派教会病院でエイズ対策プログラム部長を務めるなど、20年以上、エイズと感染症を中心としたグローバル・ヘルス分野に関わってきた。アフリカやアジアの多くの公衆衛生プログラムのアドバイザーを務める。グローバルファンドでは、その創設時から関わり、2002年1月より2003年1月まで初代の先進国 NGO 代表理事を務め、その後グローバルファンド事務局に入職、その後一貫してグローバルファンドの資金調達部門と渉外部門を統括している。ギーセン大学医学部卒。リバプール熱帯医学校で特別研修、ジョンズ・ホプキンス公衆衛生大学院より修士号を取得。その他、宗教学と社会倫理学の修士号も持つ。

Christoph Benn

Director of External Relations, The Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria

Dr Christoph Benn joined the Global Fund in 2003 and is currently the Director of External Relations. He has been responsible for mobilizing resources for the Global Fund almost since its creation in 2002, through the management of replenishment conferences and spearheading innovative approaches to resource mobilization including (PRODUCT) RED and Debt2Health.

Dr Christoph Benn is a physician (MD, University of Giessen) with specialist training in tropical medicine (Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine) and Public Health (MPH Johns Hopkins School of Public Health) with a Master's degree in religious studies and social ethics (University of Leeds).

He has more than 20 years of experience in global health with a special focus on AIDS and infectious diseases. Prior to joining the Global Fund, he worked as a clinician in the UK, Germany and as Doctor-in-Charge of a rural hospital in Tanzania. He also worked for several years as Coordinator of an AIDS Control Programme in Tanzania. From 1994-1996 he chaired the HIV/AIDS Working Group of the World Council of Churches in Geneva that developed the AIDS policy for this ecumenical body. He became a member of the first Board of Directors of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria representing Non-Governmental Organizations from developed countries from January 2002 to January 2003. From 1998-2003 he served as Deputy Director of the German Institute for Medical Mission and helped during this time to initiate several pilot projects to implement antiretroviral treatment, e.g. in Botswana, Kenya and Russia.

Dr Christoph Benn has published widely in books and scientific journals not only on international public health and HIV/AIDS but also on broader topics such as ethics and interreligious dialogue.
